



Background and Mission

The Jockey Club Scholars Alumni Association ("JCSAA") was registered as a non-profit organisation in December 2004, with a mission to build a strong network of Jockey Club Scholars to serve the society, leveraging on their diverse background and expertise.

Members

Recipients of The Hong Kong Jockey Club Scholarship automatically become members of JCSAA. They come from nine tertiary institutions in Hong Kong. To date, JCSAA has 343 members, including 235 local Scholars and 108 Mainland Scholars. Among them, 173 local Scholars and 83 Mainland Scholars have already graduated.

Organisational Structure

The Board of Directors, elected by members at the Annual General Meetings, is the highest executive body of JCSAA, responsible for final decision-making and setting directions for JCSAA's development. The Board appoints the Executive Committee to carry out daily operations and organise activities for members. Besides, the Core Project Committee plans and implement JCSAA's core project, while the Strategic Committee provides and gathers views on the future development of JCSAA. Both of them report directly to the Board. The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust as well as former Board and Executive Committee members are also advisors to JCSAA.

Community Services

JCSAA has organised a number of community service projects for elderly people, secondary school students, single-parent families, at-risk youths, young new arrivals and ethnic minority children, etc.

Schoolala is one of the signature community service projects of JCSAA. The project aims at inspiring youths to identify their goals and pursue their dreams through sharing the expertise and experience of Scholars.

Another signature project is the *Campus Visit Programme*, which provides an opportunity for new Scholars to engage in community service planning and implementation. The Programme has served the elderly and new immigrant children. It allows Scholars to mingle with people from different social dimensions, so as to learn from each other and to promote social harmony.

Apart from the two major projects, JCSAA has organised various community services, including an Arts and Health Project for the elderly, an art and performing project for children with special needs, a series of English classes and outdoor activities for new arrival students, a project to make and fly an unbelievable 100-metre-long kite with a group of at-risk youths, etc.

JCSAA believes that with the enthusiasm on community betterment, Scholars can pass on the spirit of the Hong Kong Jockey Club – volunteerism, philanthropy and commitment in the community.

Membership Activities

To nurture a strong bonding between Scholars, JCSAA organises various camps and workshops to allow Scholars to learn from each other. JCSAA also makes use of online platforms, e.g. website, blog and facebook, to keep Scholars around the world updated on its latest news and development.
