The Hong Kong Jockey Club Scholarship Scheme

Donation

The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust established the Scholarship Scheme in 1998/99. Total funds contributed to the establishment of the Scheme amount to \$107 million.

Number of Scholarships Awarded

Each year, two scholarships for local students of APA and two scholarships for local students and one scholarship for non-local Mainland students will be awarded to each of the remaining eight institutions. Starting 2005/06, three local students of APA will be awarded the Scholarship.

Scholarship Amount

- Each scholarship shall be of the value of approximately HK\$290,000 to be paid over a period of three years.
- The actual amount of each year's scholarship shall be calculated on advice of the Student Financial Assistance Agency, taking into account the actual costs of three basic components, namely, tuition, academic expenses and living costs. The universities would be notified of the annual amount at the start of each academic year.

Selection Criteria

Students should be academically outstanding or talented, have a keen interest in community services, active in extra-curricular activities, and preferably have participated in voluntary work.

Selection Mechanism

The institutions have set up their own selection panels, which make recommendations to the Board of Trustees for endorsement. Each institution is free to carry out its selection in its own way in accordance with the selection criteria.

Condition for Acceptance of Scholarship

Local awardees are required to work in Hong Kong for three years after completion of their studies.
