First round of Interactive kits for **233,000** kindergartens and primary students

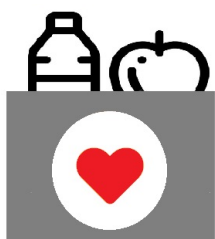


Facilities Enhancement Scheme for Pandemic Preparedness at residential care homes
